Services Provided

The Stay Together Program is provided at no cost to families as a community service. Families with children ages zero through High School, that participate with the Stay Together Program, will receive:

- *In-home consultation – individualized strategies that focus on the family's immediate concerns. These individual interactions will occur in the family's home or at a location chosen by the family at a time convenient to them.*
- *Instruction from an established skill based curriculum.*
- *24 hour crisis intervention and consultation services are available to assist new and existing families.*
- *Parent and youth workshops are held regularly at Stay Together offices for all families wishing to attend. Workshops focus on key components from our established curriculum.*


Supporting and Teaching Activities

The Stay Together Program utilizes curriculum that consists of:

- *Positive Parenting Techniques – emphasizing non-aggressive interactions between parents and youth.*
- *Builds on Family Strengths – a skill-based approach that builds on existing family strengths as well as teaching new skills to help a family be successful.*
- *Child Development Information – helps identify age-appropriate behaviors and feelings, and the necessity for developing realistic expectations of youth.*
- *Youth Skill Development – teaching basic skills, including responsibility, communication, respect, self-esteem, and social skills that enable youth to be successful at home, school, workplace, etc.*

Short Term Respite Care

Respite care may be utilized when a youth between the ages of 10-17 has been identified as a runaway. In these situations, the first course of action would include utilizing family resources, such as family members, friends, or neighbors for short-term care. If no family resources are available, respite care will then be provided through the Stay Together Program at the High Sky Children's Ranch.



Community Outreach

As an additional service to the general public, the Stay Together Program provides Universal Child Abuse Prevention and Awareness information (UCAP). One component of UCAP is offering free workshops to the community. We have various topics to choose from for both parent and youth audiences.
